VOLUNTEERING WITH GOLF STARTS AT BREC

Come enjoy the beauty of a BREC golf course all while giving back to your community. Even for those who do not want to play golf there are opportunities to get involved at your local BREC golf course. BREC golf has opportunities to get involved as both a marshal or starter.

Marshals, known as the course rangers, help manage the flow of golfers around the golf course. They may help with a tournament or during regular, recreational golf play. Marshals typically patrol the golf course in a cart and help with a variety of duties including:

- Responding to golfers' questions, requests and concerns.
- · Provide directions to golfers unfamiliar with the course.
- · Inform golfers of policies.
- Help golfers search for lost balls or suggest they give up to keep the pace of play going.
- Provide mediation for disputes.
- · Look for opportunities to care for the course.
- Most importantly, they look for ways to help with the pace of play.

Starters help to control the pace of play on the golf course by directing players to the first tee at appropriate times. Volunteers in this position should have good communication skills, organizational skills and customer service experience. Typical responsibilities include:



- Providing information regarding the course and play time.
- · Starters verify receipts for all players before they begin play.
- · They may help dispense range balls.
- Determine and track the rate of course play.
- Assigns carts.
- Supply players with score cards and rules of play.

For both marshals and starters knowledge of the game of golf is important although not required. BREC golf staff will provide training for those interested in these positions. Golf volunteers who meet the requirements may qualify for discounted play at BREC courses. Currently Dumas Memorial Golf Course is looking for both marshals and starters. Located in Greenwood Community Park, this course is approximately 15 minutes from downtown Baton Rouge. One of the

SUMMER AMERICORPS VISTA PROGRAM

AmeriCorps STEMup Baton Rouge VISTA (Volunteers in Service to America) is looking for associates to join their team this summer. These VISTA members serve in a summer STEM camp for elementary and middle school students. This is a nine-week program beginning May 29. In addition to receiving a living stipend, VISTAs are awarded an education grant at the end of their service term. The salary is \$3,467 which includes \$1,122 per month before taxes and a \$1,200 education stipend at the end is deposited into a college tuition or student loan account. This salary is paid by AmeriCorps and participants must be at least 18 years of age.
