PLAN(ting) for 2018

Get out your working boots because we're starting off the first month of the year strong. BREC invites you to join us on the second Saturday of the year for a volunteer work day. On January 13, volunteers are welcome to join us as we plant over 125 native trees along the CAPP Pennington Trail to help beautify and restore the area. With a donation through the Apache Corporation, the restoration project will help not only protect our environment from erosion but also provide resources for wildlife in the area.

What is a CAPP trail? BREC's Capital Area Pathways Project (CAPP) is an initiative to identify routes and build a network of connecting trails and greenways through East Baton Rouge Parish. Being able to host projects, and better the area, is an exciting thing for Volunteer BREC to be a part of! The CAPP program was first imagined back in 2004 and 9 years later the first phase of BREC's first trail segment, the Wards Creek "Medical Mile", was completed. Now in 2018, we have over 12 miles of safe CAPP pathways, not taking into account the different conservation and nature trails, walking loops, multi-use pathways and blueways (the NEW Highland Road Boat Launch).

The trails provide recreational benefits to residents in the southeast portion of the parish. Connecting parks, schools, trails, and businesses, the CAPP routes allow for a safe walk, jog or ride through the Health District. With more than 8 additional CAPP projects in the planning stage to wrap up the decade, citizens have expressed great appreciation for the goal of making a safer, healthier and recreation focused East Baton Rouge Parish.
